Museum of Power Events: Stationary & Steam Engine Terms & Conditions

- Owners of Stationary Engines must have at least £5 Million Public Liability Insurance cover.
- Owners of Steam Engines of any form must have at least £5 Million Public Liability Insurance cover and a current Boiler Certificate.
- Copies of current insurance must be sent to the Museum of Power events team, along with the booking form.
- All engines **MUST** adhere to the current HSE regulations.
- Applications must be received at least four weeks prior to the event date.
- Some of the Museum events are themed or limited in space, therefore the Museum reserves the right to accept stationary and steam engines and other exhibits at its discretion.
- The directions and instructions of Museum representatives must always be obeyed. Engines & Vehicles will not be parked adjacent to the Railway station on train running days or in any location which would obscure the railway sight lines.
- Gates to exhibitors and traders will be normally open at 7:30am and exhibitors should be fully set up by no later than 9:30am with all vehicles parked in the designated area/s.
- Stallholders and exhibitors arriving after 9:30am may be refused entry via the main access point onto site and redirected to the public car park.
- To ensure public safety traders and exhibitors are required to remain on site until the end of the show. In exceptional circumstances a Museum marshal must be sought to escort you safely off site.
- To ensure public safety vehicles in the Museum courtyard you must not cross the miniature railway tracks between 10am and 4:00pm unless escorted by member of the railway. Only in an emergency situation will a member of the railway be able to escort you safely off site.
- Exhibitors must display their passes at the gate.
- Exhibitor passes are valid for the driver and one passenger. All accompanying children under 16 are admitted free. Additional adults may be subject to an entry charge.
- All vehicles are restricted to 5mph whilst on site and must also apply hazard lights at any time the vehicle is moving.
- All electrical items must have a valid Portable Appliance Tested (PAT) certificate before being plugged into the Museum's utility supply. A Museum representative will be on site to test electrical equipment between 7.30am – 10.00am.
- Exhibitors and visitors must stay within the designated areas and not trespass onto adjacent Essex & Suffolk Water property or farmland.
- Children must always be supervised. The river is deep and dangerous and barriers around machinery are there for their protection.
- Dogs must always be kept on a lead and any mess cleared up properly; dog owners must use designated bins for disposal of waste.
- Litter must be bagged and placed in the bins provided. No rubbish or waste is to be thrown in the river.
- Drip trays must be used beneath machinery if there is risk of oil spillage or other lubricants.
- Running machinery must be protected by a barrier and not left unattended.
- Persons are admitted to the Museum and its grounds at their own risk. The Museum and staff will make every effort to ensure public safety and security but will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury however so caused.
- Overnight camping for stallholders and exhibitors may be available at a small cost, please contact the Museums camping manager Ruby Goodland 01621 843183 or email camping@museumofpower.org.uk for more information.
